Enhancements to Patient Dashboard

This document describes the changes being made to Patient Dashboard that will shortly be implemented at your practice.

The new version is active when "Version 3.2.3 April 2013" (or later) is displayed at the bottom of Patient Dashboard.

General Bug Fixes

A number of changes have been made to fix reported bugs and improve overall accuracy and reliability.

Improvements to Tetanus


Patient Dashboard more reliably detects whether the patient has received a vaccine containing the Tetanus antigen.

Tetanus now only shows for patients aged 45 or more, or children aged 11-15 (i.e. while Tetanus is still funded).

Smoking Status

There is a new fast way of recording the smoking status for a patient, and if appropriate, that brief advice has been given.

With the new version, the green "button" (the on the right hand side) will open a pop-up form that is very fast and which allows the smoking status to be recorded:



Note for practice managers: This can be configured through the normal customisation process. You can, for example, also configure a red "button" that opens up the previous advanced form to record smoking status in more detail if this is required.

Smoking Cessation

As with smoking status, the green "button" now opens up a very fast pop-up form that allows cessation support to be recorded:



Any of these options meet the criteria for the PHO Performance Programme.

You can continue to access the Smoking Cessation Programme and claim for services provided by clicking on "Access Cessation Programme" or directly by clicking on the red button (♥) on dashboard instead of the green button.

Body Measurements

As with the smoking sections above, when you click on the green button for body measurements, a very fast pop-up form opens to allow height and weight to be recorded and whether diet and/or exercise advice has been given. It also provides a direct link to patient hand-outs that can be printed to provide diet and exercise advice.



Influenza Vaccinations

Patients who have risk factors suggesting they may be eligible for a funded influenza vaccination will now show the specific classifications recorded for the patient that are relevant.



Additionally, children aged > 6 months and < 5 years who have respiratory conditions recorded (anything in the H READ code hierarchy) will now also be highlighted in line with recent changes to the eligibility for this vaccine.
